Guidelines for Poster Presentation

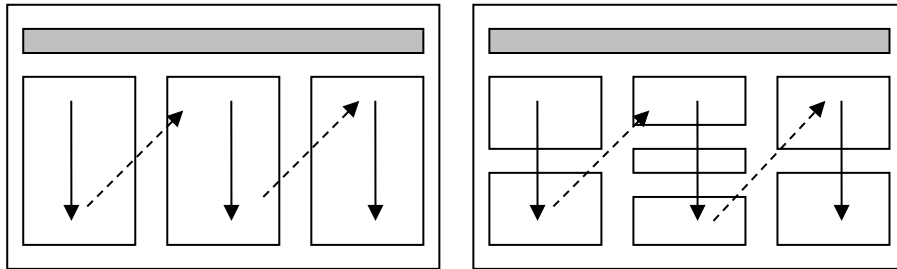
An academic poster is a visual representation of your submitted research paper. Authors should aim to use the poster as a means for generating active discussion of the research.

Design and layout

- All posters should be in **LANDSCAPE** format and displayed as E posters.
- The posters should be brought to the respective poster presentation locations 30 minutes before commencing the session on 31st August 2026 (Please refer to the programme book uploaded on the IRC 2026 website for poster presentation schedules). Please contact relevant Track Co-chair for further clarifications.
- The poster template can be found <https://npa.gov.lkposter-presentation.php>
- Whilst a poster is a visual tool it still needs to maintain a logical structure in order that a viewer can easily follow and understand your argument from start to finish.
- Poster can contain 30-40% images, 30-40% text, 20-30% empty space as appropriate. Poster must be eye-catching.
- You must also remember to mention the source of any images that you use.
- Make it obvious to the viewer how to progressively view the poster. The poster generally should read from left to right, and top to bottom.
- Presenters should send a digital copy of their final poster to **Email....** on or before 25 August 2026.

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- Presenters should also bring a copy of the digital poster to the designated poster presentation location at least 30 minutes before the commencement of their scheduled session.



Display Time

- The poster session will be held on the **31st of August 2026**, parallel with plenary/oral sessions. Posters must be displayed at respective sessions during the time of the conference. Please refer to the programme book uploaded on the National Police Academy website and/or contact relevant Track Co-chair for further clarifications.
